Start of the new 4-H year!

October 1st is the start of the new 4-H year! 4HOnline will open up for enrollment on *October 16th* after 12:00 PM. Enrollment fees will remain \$40.00 per child and new or returning volunteer leader's fees are \$5.00. Remember that the 4-H foundation has some funding available for families who may wish to ask for financial assistance.

- Returning members and volunteers need to reenroll in 4HOnline by December 21, 2018. Returning members who miss the deadline will be subject to a \$20.00 late fee and will need to submit to the Extension Office, in writing, the circumstances in which they were unable to meet the deadline.
- 4-H Clubs need to pay for all confirmed club members/volunteers by January 28, 2019.
- ⇒ Animal forms are due with payments: Show Ring Ethics (all members who wish to compete with an animal project), Animal Housing (all animals), Animal Lease (leased animals only) & Wholesome Meat (market animals) must be turned in when clubs come to pay at the Extension Office by the deadline of January 28, 2019. 
