- Blow N Go Show Review of Event
 - The Blow N Go show was an overwhelming success to all who participated! Lots of positive comments about the show.
 - Total profit from the show was \$1120 and from concessions was \$713.82 with a total profit of \$1833.82!
 - Leftover non-perishable concessions items will be used for future events. All perishable items were either purchased by volunteers or donated to a charitable organization
 - Lessons learned:
 - Water issue we need to be sure that the county has the hydrants by horse barns and goat barn working
 - LAC printer ran out of ink. Motion (Chad A) To purchase 3 ink cartridges for the LAC printer. Bill S seconded the motion and it was passed
 - Need to have more meetings prior to the 2022 event starting in January
 - Determine what needs to be done (subcommittees) and assign LAC members
 who will manage these subcommittees and report updates back to Linnea F
 - Emily T will provide a list of necessary tasks for the next Blow N Go show to Linnea for approval

- Since this is a fund raiser for the Livestock Advisory Committee, the majority of the members need to be involved with sub committees, set-up and the actual event
- Since this is not an El Paso County Fair show, it does not have to follow the Premium Book rules. One of the necessary tasks will be to come up with rules and regulations specific to this show
- May 15, 2021 Calhan Posse is putting on the Ring of Success Open Show at the El Paso County Fairgrounds. This show is full fit. Sign up on Facebook.com/Ring-Of-Success-Prospect-Show
- Swine tags were ordered from Pikes Peak Animal Supply. **Motion** (Wyatt C) to pay the invoice in the amount of \$114.25 for the swine tags. Bill S seconded the motion and it was approved.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Coolers for the livestock barns In the past, Sunbelt rented the coolers to us for \$68/week due to a mutual friend who worked there. He no longer works there so now the coolers are anywhere from \$620 to \$750/week. Since the cost has gone up so much, several volunteers have agreed to research companies who rent/sell these coolers. The swine barn size needed is 36" x 36" (filter side), but it might be possible to go up to 48" x 48". This has been tabled until the May LAC meeting
- Courtney S 2018 County Fair Check for Breeding Sheep The 4-H member's family who received this check is requesting research to be done to see if this check was ever cashed. This will be researched and is tabled until the May LAC meeting.
- Backdrop Opportunity There is a backdrop available from the 2018 National Junior Limousine Show that was made by Show Times that originally cost \$1350.00. It is currently in storage, but they are asking \$500 \$700 for it. It would need to have a wooden frame built and the materials to make that frame would be approximately \$300. We would offer them \$600 for the backdrop and then there would be \$300 in frame materials. Chad A is going to research if we could get metal for the frame any cheaper. This backdrop would be shared by the following groups and the total cost divided equally:
 - Sales Committee (\$300)
 - o Calhan Posse (\$300)
 - Livestock Advisory Committee (\$300) (pending approval)

All of this is contingent on the backdrop being in good condition.

Motion (Trey N) to approve that the LAC provide \$300 to go towards the purchase of the backdrop and frame materials contingent on the backdrop being in good condition. Wyatt C seconded the motion and it was passed.

- 2021 Fair T-Shirt Logo is done and ready to go
- Storage for LAC there was discussion on getting a storage unit for the LAC since there are multiple locations (volunteer's homes) where these goods are being stored. This will be researched and is tabled to the May LAC meeting.
