

Available Roles

As a 4-H Shooting Sports Club Rep, you'll be a front-line support for the members and families in your club. You'll share accurate and up to date information with club members throughout the year and will provide guidance as they progress through their project goals. How long is the time commitment? It's a yearlong position that should serve for an estimated between 10 to 15 hours of time through the 21-22 4-H year. *Training and all resources provided!*

As a 4-H Shooting Sports Range Keeper, your role is to help ensure the range is a safe and fun environment for 4-H members. You'll be working directly with a Shooting Sports Coach as their right-hand helper, keeping the kids safe and engaged during practices. We'll provide you with resources needed to create a welcoming environment, establish procedures, sign in/out, and other range safety practices. How long is the time commitment? It's a position that should serve for an estimated between 25 to 40 hours of time through the full 21-22 4-H year. Commitment can be for half or full 4-H year. <u>Training and all resources</u> provided!

As a 4-H Shooting Sports Range Coach, your role is to lead, teach and create a positive learning environment for our 4-H members. As the coach, you'll work with the Committee, Agent, and Inventory Manager to schedule and arrange for practice dates. You'll work within a team, which includes a Range Keeper, to support you in teaching and leading. This role requires additional training, and the coach must attend a State workshop to become certified in the discipline they wish to coach (i.e., archery, air rifle, shotgun, etc.) How long is the time commitment? The commitment can be either half or full year. It's a position that should serve for an estimated between 25 to 40 hours of time through the full 21-22 4-H year. *Training and all resources provided!* Scholarships available for training costs!




4-H Robotics Needs YOU!

Beef Tag-in

Date: February 12, 2022

Location: Owens Livestock Arena at El Paso County Fair Grounds

Back-Up Date: This date will only be used if communicated by the extension office and species superintendent due to weather. Please make sure to have both dates clear on your calendar. There are no alternate dates for tag in due to the number of volunteers it takes to run this event. February 19, 2022.

Required Sign Up (Time Slots): Time slots will be assigned this year so please fill out the google survey link to be assigned to a time slot. This form MUST be filled out and submitted by January 21 to participate in beef tag in. https://bit.ly/3G6l8O9

Expectations:

- Please be on time or early! If you show up late or past your time slot you will have to be moved to the back of the line. We believe in giving priority to those scheduled in their time slot so we will not allow families who are late or miss their time slot to cut in front of others.
- If our team is running behind, please be patient as we are working with live animals and technology.
- You must bring your animal with a halter already on before it will be unloaded, or it will not be tagged, retinal scanned, or weighed.
- Any uncontrollable animals will **NOT** be tagged, retinal scanned, or weighed! This is at the discretion of the extension agent and species superintendent. The idea is to work with them ahead of time!
- Please have your calves brand inspected prior to coming to tag-in. Do not forget to bring your brand inspection
 papers.
- Tag-in is the only time State Fair Nominations will be taken and it will cost \$3 per animal nominated
- Retinal scans at tag-in are \$3.00 per animal due at tag in.
- The first 6 ear tags free, \$1.00 per tag over six.
- Only CASH accepted.
- Fees are due before the animal can cross the scale and be tagged in.
- ALL ANIMALS MUST BE CASTRATED PRIOR TO BEING WEIGHED AND TAGGED AS A 4-H MARKET PROJECT. CASTRATION MUST BE DONE PRIOR TO ARRIVING AT THE FAIRGROUNDS (NOT THE DAY OF TAG-IN) AND HEALED AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE. ALL MUST BE DEHORNED.

State Fair Nomination Cards and Premise ID's: Remember all 4-H and FFA exhibitors must have their premise ID# on their nomination cards to be accepted for State Fair. This is a State Fair Policy **NOT** a requirement to participate in the local 4-H program. This information should be completed on nomination card at the time of tag-in. You will need to apply for your premise ID

number well in advance of tag-in, so they have time to assign you one. Please do so 3-4 weeks before you need it. Please call 303-869-9000 to get your ID or apply online at https://ag.colorado.gov/animals/colorado-location-identification-lid-registration-premises







Livestock Producer Nominations

What are Producer Livestock Classes?

Producer classes are livestock classes for exhibitors at county fair who raised their own exhibit animals in market sheep, market goat, market swine, and market beef. Individuals who breed and raise their own animals will show against one another.

Project Enrollment in 4-HOnline:

You must be enrolled in the breeding project in 4-HOnline. It is also important to note you will turn in a breeding livestock record book for this project at the end of the 4-H year.

Paperwork Requirements for January 31st (dam):

4-H members must nominate their producer project animal by filling out a form (the limit for each youth member is 10 animals). This is a **TWO-PART** process for the form so please read these instructions carefully. The first part, the dam nomination (top half of the form) is due **January 31**st. The forms can be found on our website under 4-H, Member Resources, Project Resources. The rules and nomination procedure are the same for all species.

The top half of the form will ask for all the information of the dam that includes breed, breed registration if applicable, tag/tattoo/ear notch numbers, birth date, date breed, brand inspection or copy of registration, two photographs of each profile view of the animal. Underneath the photo, please identify the dam that includes the animal ID or tag number (some form of identification on the animal such as ear notches on swine, tattoos for goats, etc. must be used).

**Please note that most producer nominations for beef cattle can complete the whole form and turn it in by January 31

Paperwork Requirements for May 1st (offspring):

The second part, the offspring nomination (bottom half of the form) is due **May 1**st.

The bottom half of the form will ask for all the information of the offspring that includes breed, breed registration if applicable, tag/tattoo/ear notch numbers, birth date, dam's name, market (breeding producer classes are no longer offered), and two photographs of each profile view of the animal.

In addition to the form, at least two digital photographs must be taken of the animal with its dam so that any distinguishing marks are visible (this should be accomplished prior to the animal being weaned). The form asks for two photos one of each side taken of the profile. Underneath the photo, please identify the animal and dam that includes the animal ID or tag number (some form of identification on the animal such as ear notches on swine, tattoos for goats, etc. must be used).

Organizational club leaders must verify nominations stating they have visited the 4-H members' stock and have verified that the above listed animals are solely owned by the 4-H member.

Scholarship Opportunities

4-H Scholarship Opportunities

*Please check requirements and due dates carefully. If reference letter is needed please request no later than 2 weeks before submission deadline

Colorado 4-H awards scholarships annually to outstanding youth who have actively engaged in Colorado 4-H clubs for at least 3 years. **The scholarship process is competitive and open from November 1, 2021 through March 1, 2022.** Scholarship recipients will be announced in May 2022. There are opportunities available for all kinds of students, including for those attending trade schools or junior colleges, transfer students, and continuing students.

If you are ready to begin your application, <u>click here</u> to access the AcademicWorks application portal. Once signed in, the first step is to apply using the General Application, where specific questions will be asked to determine which of the scholarships you are eligible for using defined criteria.

Sign Up to create an account using a valid email address. Password must include 1 digit, 1 uppercase letter and 1 lowercase letter. Once you've created an account, log into your email to activate your account.

Sign In to log in to an existing account

- Complete and submit the General Application.
- Complete and submit Supplemental Application(s) if required.
- Review your Recommended opportunities (at the top of the Colorado 4-H Scholarship Application, hover over 'Opportunities' and then click, 'Recommended').
 - * Some scholarships may ask additional questions specific to that particular scholarship. Click the 'Apply' button to answer any remaining questions.
 - * If no action is required on a Recommended scholarship, then your General and/or Supplemental application are all that is/are required.


