HPAI Detected in Colorado

I wanted to give you all an update on the current HPAI (Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza) outbreak. For the first time ever, it has been confirmed in the state of Colorado. It was confirmed in wild Snow and Ross' geese in Sedgwick county at Jumbo Reservoir. This is just south of Julesburg Reservoir between Sterling and Julesburg. I know this feels far away from El Paso County, but I want to remind everyone about taking precautions with your own flocks.

Look at your current biosecurity measures and tighten them up if you can. Reduce the occurrence of wild birds, especially waterfowl, from interacting with your flock. House your waterfowl separate from your chickens. Keep shoes that are for your coop only and do not wear them elsewhere. This disease is highly transmissible through shoes, tires, feed containers and other fomite sources. As we are warming up and you are getting out and about in watershed, lakes, rivers, or other areas where wild waterfowl frequent, make sure you sterilize any shoes worn and wash your clothes before interacting with your birds.

If you have sudden death in your flock, please reach out to CSU Avian Surveillance in Fort Collins right away at 970-297-4008. If you see 3 or more dead wild birds in a 2-week period or birds showing clinical signs, please notify the local Colorado Parks and Wildlife office. I have attached a link with more info about the current outbreak. Please do not take this lightly, any flock with a positive case is required to be depopulated because of the pathogenic nature of this disease.

Currently there have been 59 flocks (commercial and backyard) that have been culled totally about 14.2 million birds and of those 23 were backyard flocks and nearly 2000 birds. About 1/3 of these flocks are in the central flyway which clips Colorado. There are new reports coming in almost daily with the first reported case on Feb 8th. Please reach out to me if you have questions, I'll try to help you with answers or get you to someone who can help you.

Colorado's State Veterinarian advised issuing an emergency rule suspending all poultry shows, including meets, sales, swaps, and competitions. The state's Agricultural Commission approved this emergency rule on March 30. The rule takes effect immediately and will last for 90 days, unless renewed or ended at an earlier date by vote of the Ag Commission and a recommendation of the State Veterinarian.

All 4-H programs and project work involving poultry would fall under this category. Updates to guidelines as issued by our State 4-H program will be communicated as information comes in.

7. Next to the name of the exhibitor, select "Add an Entry".











9. Select the club you are associated with. IMPORTANT: This must be the club you are listed with on 4HOnline.

Join the Livestock Quizbowl Team

Calling all youth in livestock projects to join the Livestock Quizbowl Team. The Quizbowl team works together to answer a series of questions about livestock and small stock. Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) Training Requirement

Meat Quality Assurance Training teaches the youth about the quality of meat and food products that come from livestock. Quality assurance for livestock producers means making a promise to the consumers, or the people who consume the meat, eggs, milk and dairy products, from food production animals. The promise made is that products from livestock will be the highest possible quality and producers will do everything possible to make these products safe to eat.

- MQA Training will be offered twice a year. For the 2022, the format that will be used is a classroom style learning or a hands-on trailer session.
- A written test will follow the training and must be passed with an 80% or higher.
- The project areas required to complete MQA training is goats, sheep, cattle, swine, poultry, and rabbit.
- All first year 4-H members and current 4-H members advancing to intermediate (11 years old) or senior (14 years old) 4-H members must complete a Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) workshop if enrolled in goat, beef, sheep, swine, poultry or rabbit project(s).
- All 4-H members are required to attend a MQA training during their first year in a livestock/ rabbit/poultry projects regardless of their age.
- This must be done at least <u>45 days prior to the El Paso County Fair</u> in order to be eligible to exhibit at the county and/or state fair(s).
- Proof of compliance must be submitted to the El Paso County Extension Office.
- If the 4-H member is unable to attend an MQA workshop in El Paso County, the 4-H member may attend an MQA workshop in another county (information for completion must be sent to El Paso County office by the deadline from the county that the MQA training was completed in)

Market Beef Rate of Gain Contest

The Rate of Gain contest for youth enrolled in market beef will have a re-weigh date on **May 7th from 7:00-8:00 AM.** If you miss the time frame for the re-weigh, you will not be eligible for the contest--no exceptions.



Animals must be led across the parking lot and scale, as there will not be any alleyways to help guide.

Attending the re-weigh date listed above is one of the required steps to be eligible for this contest. If you have any more questions, the entire contest is outlined in the premium book.



2022 JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE RULES

Sale Date: Saturday, July 23, 2022 - 1:00 p.m.

- 1. An exhibitor is defined as any member in good standing enrolled in 4-H or FFA in El Paso County. Exhibitors that are enrolled in both 4-H and FFA are limited to the sale of one market project, regardless of species or club designation.
- 2. TO PARTICIPATE IN THE JUNIOR LIVESTOCK SALE (Sale), THE MARKET EXHIBITOR AND/OR A PARENT/GUARDIAN MUST RETURN A SALE RELEASE CONTRACT, LIABILITY RELEASE FORM, AND A COMPLETED W-9 FORM, INCLUDING THEIR SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER NO LATER THAN 4:00 P.M. ON THE DAY OF THE EXHIBITOR'S LAST MARKET SHOW. IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE TO SELL. (Example 1: An exhibitor only shows market sheep and the market sheep show is on Monday. The exhibitor must return their sale release by 4:00 p.m. on Monday in order to be eligible to sell. Example 2: An exhibitor shows market sheep and market beef. The market sheep show is on Monday and the market beef show is on Thursday. The exhibitor must return their sale release by 4:00 p.m. on Thursday in order to be eligible to sell.
- 3. All Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in each species must be sold. A Sales Release form is required for ALL Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in each species. In the event that an exhibitor owns both Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in any species, that individual will be required to sell both animals. In addition, an exhibitor who has Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champion that must sell, may sell another animal of a different species, if enrolled and exhibiting in another market project. This rule takes precedence over the one youth, one animal rule. In the instance that an exhibitor qualifies to sell more than one market animal, as the result of exhibiting the Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champion animal, then the exhibitor's additional animal(s) will sell at the end of the final round of that species, respectively.
- 4. The commission charge will be no more than **5%** of the total sale proceeds for Poultry, Rabbits, Swine, Goats, Sheep, and Beef. The Livestock Sale Committee reserves the right to lower the commission charge percentage based on the results of the Junior Livestock Sale.
- 5. In the event the Grand Champion and/or Reserve Grand Champion Market Beef are designated "buybacks," the Livestock Sale Committee will ensure that both are entered into the Beef Carcass Contest, if one is held. Others designated by the primary buyer as "buybacks" may or may not be available for the Beef Carcass Contest. Miniature breeds of cattle will not be eligible to sell in the Livestock Sale or participate in the Beef Carcass Contest due to the small frame and conformance with the USDA Packing house grid.

- 6. Once in the sale ring, the animal will be sold to the highest bidder.
- 7. For beef, sheep, goats, hogs, rabbits and poultry, this is a **TERMINAL SALE**. All sale animals will be slaughtered. Prospective buyers will be required to sign an agreement prior to the sale signifying their acceptance of the terminal sale policy. A "buy back" arrangement will be provided for the buyers of a market animal.
- 8. Any and all market animals sold through the sale will only be hauled by the Livestock Sale Committee or their Designees to the packers selected by the buyers. Animals designated as "buybacks" will be released or delivered only to the buyback buyer by the Livestock Sale Committee. There will be no exceptions. Arrangements for poultry and rabbits will be coordinated between the Small Animal Committee and the Livestock Sale Committee. The Livestock Sale Committee will not hold animals after the sale, unless there is reason to suspect a violation of the Sale Rules put in place by the Livestock Sale Committee or to accommodate a locker processing schedule. In such a case, the Livestock Sale Committee will arrange for the care of the animal until the issue has been resolved and appropriate arrangements are made for the animal(s) in guestion.
- 9. Market animals are not permitted to be listed for private treaty sale until 10:00 a.m. on sale day.
- 10. Animals sold at private treaty must be hauled at owner's expense. THE LIVESTOCK SALE COMMITTEE WILL NOT HAUL PRIVATE TREATY ANIMALS.
- 11. Condition of Sale: Exhibitors are required to adhere to the rules and regulations set forth in the El Paso County 4-H/FFA Livestock Show Premium Book. All livestock sold and slaughtered will have to comply with the Show Ring Code of Ethics, IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics, and Wholesome Meat Act. Any surgical procedures or injection of any foreign substance or drug or external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant, or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, conformation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited and said animal will not be allowed to sell. All exhibitors must certify their compliance with manufacturer's pre-market withdrawal periods specified for any and all medications, drugs, pesticides, or feed additives administered. The use of any non-approved chemical or improper use of approved chemicals is strictly prohibited. All animals must have completed all medication withdrawal times regardless to whether it is over the counter, prescription, or extra label use prior to weigh-in at the El Paso County Fair.
- 12. All heifers must be accompanied by a certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian verifying the heifer is pregnancy tested OPEN within 30 days of the El Paso County Fair.
- 13. Only market animals that meet weight requirements and show in their respective market class are eligible for the Livestock Sale.
- 14. All Sale Animals will be sold by the head or lot in the case of poultry and rabbits. The Livestock Sale Committee reserves the right to limit the number of head or lots sold.
- 15. No artificial decoration, sign or paint of any type will be permitted on any animal entering the sale ring. Violators of this rule will not be permitted to sell in the annual Livestock Sale.
- 16. Exhibitors will be asked to provide information on the Sale Release form to share with potential buyers during the Sale. Exhibitors are not to pass notes to the auctioneer while entering the sale ring. There will be **NO** announcement of any sort of "premium" attached to a designated animal for

- the purchaser of that animal. If any concerns arise regarding the exhibitor/sale animal, those concerns need to be addressed to the Sale Manager to communicate to other parties involved.
- 17. No exhibitor, under any circumstance, shall leave the sale ring until after the bidding process is completed on their market animal.
- 18. Any exhibitor needing additional help in the sale ring must submit the reason for accompaniment and obtain approval from the Sale Manager for the request. In such circumstances, any additional parties must be currently enrolled 4-H members.
- 19. The Livestock Sale Committee reserves the right to random drug screen any and all potential market sale animals.
- 20. If a carcass tests positive for any of the "Condition of Sale" terms listed in Item #11 above, but still remains suitable for consumer consumption in accordance with USDA/FDA Regulations, exhibitor MAY receive the current market rate quoted at the time of the sale (commonly referred to as Buyback Price) less the cost of any additional drug screening, legal fees, and any other associated costs incurred by the Livestock Sale Committee related to the testing and processing of the animal. If payment is issued to exhibitor, a statement of costs incurred will be issued along with the payment.
- 21. If a carcass is condemned (not suitable for consumer consumption) for any reason, the exhibitor will NOT receive any premium or current market rate payment. The Livestock Sale Committee will then contact the purchaser of said animal and orchestrate reimbursement of monies or any other decision deemed suitable per said buyer.
- 22. Exhibitors, parents and club leaders of all market animals must certify their compliance with the USDA Wholesome Meat Act by completing and signing a "Certification and Disclosure Statement" and Show Ring Code of Ethics and turning it in with their 4-H enrollment.
- 23. Sale rotation order for 2022: Swine, Sheep, Beef, Goats, Rabbits, Poultry. ALL MARKET SPECIES will be divided based on total animals for sale within each species and sold in groups within the rotation order. ALL Grand and Reserve Grand Champions of all species will sell in a group at the beginning of the sale. All species will sell in CLASS PLACING order within their groups in the rotation. Exhibitors are asked to pay special attention to the posted sale catalog and their respective superintendents to determine their place in the sale order. If an exhibitor is not in line when scheduled to sell, they will forfeit their privilege to sell.
 - a. The Livestock Sale Committee reserves the right to amend the sale order rotation defined in Item 23, including the format of the Sale of Champions typically conducted at the beginning of the sale, in order to facilitate adherence to any potential pandemic guidelines and/or restrictions that are in place at the time of the Sale.
- 24. All Market Livestock entered in the El Paso County Fair MUST Be Photographed WithThe Exhibitor. Photographs must be taken at the designated times by the OFFICIAL livestock photographer employed by the Livestock Sale Committee. An exhibitor who wishes to sell in the Sale and does not have a picture taken at the designated times must arrange to have an acceptable picture taken by the official livestock photographer; the exhibitor must then deliver it to the Livestock Sale Committee prior to the Livestock Sale. This will be at the exhibitor's expense. The photographer may or may not be able to schedule the exhibitor for such a picture, but if so, will collect a CASH fee in advance from the exhibitor for this service. Failure to do so will result in disqualification from the Livestock Sale.

- 25. As soon as his/her animal sells, each exhibitor is **REQUIRED** to take the appropriate paperwork to his/her buyer in the audience and then return said paperwork to the sale clerk as soon as the buyer completes it. **This needs to be done immediately after selling**, so each exhibitor should arrange for a parent, leader, or another member to hold or stall the sale animal while the paperwork is being completed by the buyer. **Please do not ask the superintendents to do this**.
 - a. The Livestock Sale Committee reserves the right to amend the paperwork requirements defined in Item 25 in order to facilitate adherence to any potential pandemic guidelines and/or restrictions that are in place at the time of the Sale.
- 26. Sale Checks will be MAILED to exhibitors by the Livestock Sale Committee WITHIN 10 to 20 BUSINESS DAYS FOLLOWING THE SALE. Prior to receiving a check, each market exhibitor must write an acceptable and approved thank-you note to the buyer(s) of their animal, any Add On Contributor(s), and to designated Livestock Sale sponsors and turn in said note(s) in an unsealed envelope to the Livestock Sale Committee.

Names and addresses of buyers will be provided to exhibitors once the Add On Premium feature of the Sale closes 48 hours after the live auction. **The Livestock Sale Committee will mail the thank-you notes to the buyers** following the fair. If the thank-you is not received by the Livestock Sale Committee, the market exhibitor's check will be held until the thank-you is sent to the Sale Manager.

- a. The Livestock Sale Committee reserves the right to amend the timeframes defined in Item 26 for sale checks and thank-you notes in order to facilitate adherence to any potential pandemic guidelines and/or restrictions that are in place at the time of the Sale. Regardless, each market exhibitor will be required to turn in designated thankyou notes to the Livestock Sale Committee, prior to receiving a proceeds check.
- 27. Any reissue of sale checks for any reason will incur a \$30.00 service fee, which will be deducted at the time of reissue.
- 28. All scholarship winners must be in the arena at 12:15 p.m. on sale day for presentation of scholarship awards.
- 29. 4-H/FFA members are encouraged to pass refreshments provided by the Livestock Sale Committee after sale paperwork is completed.
- 30. Any request for exceptions to the aforementioned livestock rules must be submitted in writing to the Livestock Sale Committee. The Livestock Sale Committee will then deliberate and the decision made by the Livestock Sale Committee will be final.
- 31. In the event a market animal consigned to the Livestock Sale should need medical treatment prior to the Livestock Sale, the exhibitor, exhibitor's parent/guardian, County designated veterinarian, CSU Extension Agent, and Sale Committee will confer regarding the course of treatment and continued Livestock Sale eligibility. The final decision regarding the terms of the exhibitor's continued participation in the Livestock Sale resides with the Sale Committee.
- 32. The Livestock Sale Committee reserves the right to amend the terms of the Junior Livestock Sale Rules as necessary in order to facilitate adherence to any potential pandemic guidelines and/or restrictions that are in place at the time of the Sale.

Thinking of purchasing an animal from the Junior Livestock Auction to fill your freezer?

The following provides information to help explain what your purchase gives you.

Meat Yield - Explained

Live weight: The weight of animal during the auction.

Carcass weight: The weight of the animal after inedible parts are removed, such as internal organs, head, hide, and blood.

Dressing%: The percentage of the live animal weight that becomes the carcass weight at slaughter.

Packaged meat%: The percentage of the carcass weight that becomes retail cuts that the buyer will receive after processing.

The weights and percentages can vary due to animal live weight, fat-to-muscle ratio, breed, diet, gender, age, and cutting preferences (fat trimming, bone-in/out and desired cuts).







Livestock Purchasing Options

RETAIN FOR YOUR OWN USE/CUSTOM HARVEST

Buyer keeps ownership of purchased animal and pays full bid price to the Livestock Sale Committee. The buyer selects a custom processor from the provider list. The animal will be transported to the custom processor the buyer selects at no additional cost. The buyer then calls the custom processor on the Monday following the Sale and provides them with cutting instructions for the meat. The buyer pays the processing cost to the custom processor when the meat is picked up.

BUYBACK

The buyer is obligated to pay only the difference between the market price and the full bid price (your bid). The Livestock Sale Committee will buy back the animal at market price. The buyer pays only the difference to the Sale Committee. **NO** other arrangements are necessary.

ADD-ON OPTION

If you wish to support the exhibitors but are unable to purchase an animal, you have the option to do "Add-On" money. If you choose this option, you can add a set dollar amount to a specific exhibitor's animal. This can be accomplished by completing an "Add On" form or through the Online Sale Portal.

Purchasing market animals from 4-H and FFA Members is an economical way to fill your freezer with top quality meat for your family!



Frequently Asked Questions

What if I cannot use a whole animal?

A group of friends or co-workers can pool their resources to buy an entire animal and have plenty of meat in the freezer all year round

How do I get the meat processed?

The Livestock Sale Committee will transport the animal to the custom processor you select from the custom processor list provided in the Sale Program. At that point, you contact the custom processor and select how you would like the product cut and packaged.

How do I purchase an animal?

If you are unfamiliar with the Junior Livestock Sale process, please contact the Sale Manager for details and instructions on how to purchase animals at the live auction or online.

How much freezer space will an animal take up?

Freezer space required for frozen meat can vary from 35-50 pounds per cubic foot, depending on how it is wrapped, amount of bone, and shape of the cut.

What can I expect to spend in processing?

Processing varies by custom processor and is generally broken down into two parts: butcher; and cut, wrap, and freeze. Costs are also dependent upon the species, as well as the weight of the animal. Contact the Sale Manager to obtain copies of the custom processing price lists.

What are the payment terms of the Sale?

Payment may be made by personal/business check, cash, debit or credit card at any time during the sale or at the conclusion thereof. In order to promptly remit payments to our exhibitors, we appreciate payments within 24 hours of the Sale.

Who Sells Animals at the Fair?

The 4-H and FFA livestock projects allow youth to have hands-on experience and acquire an understanding of market animal production by preparing for, purchasing, caring for, and keeping records on the animal. They gain a better understanding of the business aspects and economics of purchasing animals, feed nutrition, facilities, and equipment. These young people learn entrepreneurial skills and become advocates of animal agriculture.

Why should I purchase at the Junior Livestock Sale?

- Members select high quality animals for their project and maintain that quality until it reaches the finished product.
- Members are required to complete quality assurance training ensuring their knowledge and performance of safe production practices.
- As a buyer, you will have control of how your meat is processed, cut, and wrapped.
- By purchasing, you will show pride and support to the local community and its youth.
- Buyers receive publicity for yourself and/or your business.
- You, as a buyer, have the opportunity to know the person who raised the animal, where it specifically came from, and that it was grown locally.
- The difference between the purchase price and the market value of the animal may be tax deductible.
- While there may be a small surplus cost, it is worth the extra price if you consider the safety issues, as well as the benefits to the local economy.

Knowing that all the meat comes from one locally raised animal, knowing that your are helping a young person in your county to remain involved in agriculture and knowing that you are helping to keep farms as part of our county's landscape adds value to your purchase.

Swine Tag Pickup & Dropoff

- Any youth member that plans on showing MARKET Swine at County Fair needs to fill
 out the google survey by April 15, 2022. https://docs.google.com/forms/d/

- 2. Please make sure that the youth member is enrolled in the 4-H Program and Market Swine Project. Members/families will not be given tags until the member intending to exhibit swine in 2022 is actively enrolled in the 4HOnline system. There is **NO EXCEPTION** to this rule.
- 3. The swine project members are responsible for tagging their own animals, pulling DNA samples, and filling out the nomination forms. The first step is to attend Swine Tag Pick Up on April 28, 2022 at Swink Hall (El Paso County Fairgrounds) from 6:30-8:00 PM to pick up tags. Please remember these important items the night you attend:
 - A. DNA envelopes cost \$3 per animal (CASH)
 - B. State fair nominations cost \$3 per animal (CASH)
 - C. The money will be collected on April 28 in CASH only
 - D. If the weather is bad, please block off May 2nd as the backup day
 - E. First and second year families are expected to attend the tagging clinic at 6:00 PM that night in order to receive their tags
- 4. You will need to purchase a tagger if you do not already own one. It must be a specific brand to work with the Y-Tex tags that you will receive. There are two links attached as a reference to what you need to purchase:
- A. UltraTagger Compact by Y-Tex (This is the recommended one that features a quick release pin.) https://www.valleyvet.com/ct_detail.html?pgguid=448c7d11-2eae-430f-b7f7-8d0d12ee88d4
 - B. UltraTagger Plus Applicator by Y-Tex

 It is also recommended a that you have blood stop, corn starch, or baking flour on hand in case you hit a vein when tagging. If you hit the vein and the bleeding does not stop in 15-20 minutes, contact your local vet. We will have detailed instructions in the packet available for the families to use.
- 5. Once the youth complete the outlined steps above the nomination forms, DNA envelopes, and extra tags need to be dropped off on May 7th at the Owens Livestock Arena from 7:30-9:00 AM, no exceptions. All paperwork and pictures must be completed in order to be accepted at the deadline.

We will not be differentiating between species so bring goats and/or sheep based on your last name. More details on the registration google link above.

Expectations:

- Please be on time!
- We believe in giving priority to those scheduled in their slot so we will not allow families who
 are late or miss their time slot to cut in front of others.
- If our team is running behind, **please be patient** as we are working with live animals, technology, and a new process so sometimes it does not allows go as plan or expected.
- Only **CASH** will be accepted the day of tag in (read below for details on price breakouts) State Fair Nominations will only be accepted the day of tag in, no exceptions.

Things to know before coming:

- You must bring your animal with a halter already on before it will be unloaded, or it will not be weighed. The idea is to work with them ahead of time.
- If your animals are <u>sick or show signs of score mouth and/or fungus</u> please email <u>Emily.Tobler@colostate.edu</u> and we will have you go across the scale and tag in at the end.
- Market ewes and market does MUST be scrapies tagged before tag-in. Please reach out to Emily.Tobler@colostate.edu if you have any questions.
- <u>Must Park in the South Parking Lot</u> and <u>stay off the concrete in the Owens Livestock Arena</u>. Will walk animals to the scale from the North Arena Door.
- Tag-in is the only time State Fair Nominations will be taken and will cost \$3 to nominate per animal (cash only)

Remember all 4-H and FFA exhibitors must have their **premise ID#** on their nomination cards to be accepted for State Fair. This is a State Fair Policy NOT a requirement to participate in the local 4-H program. This information should be completed on ALL cards at the time of tag-in.

You will need to apply for your premise ID number well in advance of tag in so they have time to assign you one. Please do so 3-4 weeks before you need it. Please call 303-869-9000 to get your ID or visit the website at https://ag.colorado.gov/animals/colorado-location-identification-lid-registration-premises.

Retinal scans at tag-in are \$3.00 per animal due at tag in (CASH ONLY). The first 6 ear tags free, \$1.00 per tag over six. Only cash will be accepted. Fees are due on the date of tag in.

REMEMBER: All animals must be castrated prior to being weighed and tagged in as a 4-H Market project. Castration must be done prior to arriving at the fairgrounds (Not the day of tag in) and healed as much as possible.



2022 Essay Topic: Transportation: Minimizing Stress on Bees While Getting Them Where They Need to Be

Each Year, approximately 1.5 million honey bee colonies make the trip to California to pollinate almonds, mostly via large trucks. The movement of these colonies, along with another half million colonies based in CA, constitute the largest insect migration event in the world (albeit assisted migration). Many beekeepers often need to move colonies to various apiary locations, for local pollination, etc. What are the major stresses on bees during local and long distance* transportation?

In your essay, please give specific examples for how those stresses can be minimized when moving colonies within the apiary, during short distance movement among local apiaries, and during long-distance movement across state lines. Writers are encouraged to include photos and interviews with commercial beekeepers, citing state laws for transport of bees.

*Long- Distance bee moving is any move that cannot be accomplished in one night, and therefore the load must be netted so that the bees don't fly off the truck during the day. Any other beehive movement can be considered local even though it may be 250-mile trip or longer.

Put on Your Thinking Cap!

An essential judging criterion is the scope of research you put forth in developing the ideas behind your essay—accounting for 40% of your score. The number of sources consulted, the authority of the sources and the variety of the sources are all evaluated. Personal interviews with beekeepers and others familiar with the subject are valued sources of information and should be documented.

Note that "honey bee" is properly spelled as two words, even though many otherwise authoritative references spell it as one word.

Eligibility:

The 2022 Colorado 4-H Beekeeping Essay Competition is open to any active 4-H Club members only. Youth selected as the Colorado 4-H Beekeeping Essay winner will be sent onto the National Competition by May 15.

Entered essays must encompass the designated topic only. There will be no exceptions.

Competition Rules & Essay Requirements:

Any 4-H Club member interested in writing an essay should contact their local 4-H office for competition details. The state entry will be through 4honline events.

Failure to meet any one of the essay requirements will result in disqualification.

- Essay requirements for state and national judging:
 - Essay must be typewritten or computer-generated on single-sided pages and formatted following standard manuscript format using double-spaced type and 12pt font in legible font face.
 - Essay must encompass the designated topic in 750 to 1,000 words. Word count does not include sources, works cited or the writer's biographical statement.
 - o All factual statements and interview references must be cited in a "sources" or "bibliography" list.
 - Essays will be judged on (a) scope of research, 40%; (b) accuracy, 30%; (c) creativity, 10%;
 (d) conciseness, 10%; and (e) logical development of the topic, 10%.
 - On a separate page, please include a brief biographical statement of the writer including mailing address, email address and phone number.
- Each youth may submit only ONE entry.
- Deadline for state submission: April 29,2022
- State winners will be announced: May 15, 2022
- Deadline for national submission: May 15, 2022
- National winners will be announced: June 15, 2022

National competition entries will be submitted for judging by the Colorado 4-H superintendent.

Decisions made by the judges of the Colorado 4-H contest judging are final. All state competition entries become the property of the Colorado 4-H program and may be used as either program sees fit. No essays will be returned.

Awards:

Three cash prizes will be awarded in the 2022 Colorado State 4-H Beekeeping Essay Competition. The author of the highest scoring essay will win first prize. The author of the second-highest scoring essay will win second prize. The author of the third-highest scoring essay will win third prize.

First Prize: \$100Second Prize: \$75Third Prize: \$25

The three prize-winning essays will be published in State 4-H Newsletter and recognized at the Colorado State 4-H Conference. Essays will also be framed and displayed at the Colorado State Fair. All authors of essays submitted to the national competition will receive a relevant book on honey bees, beekeeping or honey.






