

Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF)

Citizenship Washington Focus (CWF) is a 4-H civic engagement experience for high school youth. Every summer teens from across the country gather at the National 4-H Conference Center, near Washington, D.C., to learn what it means to be a strong leader in their community, country and world. These objectives are met through pre-trip education, speakers, workshops, daily excursions to view national sites, a day at the Capitol with an elected official, as well as a delegate-designed and implemented action plan.

Eligibility requirements:

Delegates must be at least 15 years old by January 1 of the current year and currently involved in an Extension-sponsored 4-H youth program.

Delegates must have at least one year of leadership experience and be currently active in a leadership position in the organization she/he represents.

Delegates must have demonstrated an active interest in citizenship/community service programs in their club and/or at the county level.

Delegates must complete an official application for Citizenship-Washington Focus and upload a clear, glossy picture for publicity.

Register:

Eligible member(s) use the 2023 CWF Application Process through the 4-HOnline Event Registration section and follow the Application Procedures for Selecting Delegates document by March 31.

Cost: \$2,400-\$2,900 (Funds can be applied for through the El Paso County 4-H Foundation Committee

Meat Quality Assurance (MQA)

Meat Quality Assurance Training teaches the youth about the quality of meat and food products that come from livestock. Quality assurance for livestock producers means making a promise to the consumers, or the people who consume the meat, eggs, milk and dairy products, from food production animals. The promise made is that products from livestock will be the highest possible quality and producers will do everything possible to make these products safe to eat.

- MQA Training will be offered twice a year. For 2023, a classroom style format will be used.
- The project areas required to complete MQA training is goats, sheep, cattle, swine, poultry, and rabbit.
- All first year 4-H members and current 4-H members advancing to intermediate (11 years old) or senior (14 years old) 4-H members must complete a Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) workshop if enrolled in goat, beef, sheep, swine, poultry or rabbit project(s).
- All 4-H members are required to attend a MQA training during their first year in a livestock/rabbit/ poultry projects regardless of their age.
- This must be done at least 45 days prior to the El Paso County Fair in order to be eligible to exhibit at the county and/or state fair(s).
- Proof of compliance must be submitted to the El Paso County Extension Office.
- If the 4-H member is unable to attend an MQA workshop in El Paso County, the 4-H member may attend an MQA workshop in another county (information for completion must be sent to El Paso County office by the deadline from the county that the MQA training was completed in)

Thursday April 20, 2023, at 6:00 PM (Location at the Extension Office) Classroom Session

Animal ID's in 4HOnline due by May 1

Animal ID's for horse, miniature horse, pygmy goat, dairy goat, breeding livestock, cat, dog, and camelids (Ilama/alpaca) in 4H Online are due by May 1, 2023. If Animal ID's for the above projects are not in by May 1 the animals are not eligible to show at the county fair. Market livestock, rabbit, and poultry do <u>NOT</u> get entered into 4H Online.

This is the final draft of the Sale Rule revision to take place for fair in 2023 and 2024. We want to thank all the families that offered input by email or in person and we feel we have come to a good compromise for all parties. Families with questions regarding this rule can reach out to the Sale Committee at epcojrlive-stocksalecommittee@gmail.com

Original wording:

All Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in each species must be sold. A Sales Release form is required for ALL Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in each species. In the event that an exhibitor owns both Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in any species, that individual will be required to sell both animals. In addition, an exhibitor who has Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champion that must sell, may sell another animal of a different species, if enrolled and exhibiting in another market project. This rule takes precedence over the one youth, one animal rule. In the instance that an exhibitor qualifies to sell more than one market animal, as the result of exhibiting the Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champion animal, then the exhibitor's additional animal(s) will sell at the end of the final round of that species, respectively.

NEW for 2023:

All Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in each species must be sold. A Sales Release form is required for ALL Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in each species. In the event that an exhibitor owns both Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champions in any species, that individual will be required to sell both animals. In addition, an exhibitor who has Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champion that must sell, may sell one other animal of any market species. This rule takes precedence over the one youth, one animal rule. In the instance that an exhibitor qualifies to sell more than one market animal, as the result of exhibiting the Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champion animal, then the exhibitor's additional animal will sell at the end of the auction in the 4th round. Round 4 for be for any lots resulting from extra animals.

Ex: Exhibitor has the Grand beef; they can sell another beef. The exhibitor has Reserve Turkey and Grand goat, then they can sell **one** other animal of any species to sell in round 4.

NEW for 2024:

All Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in each species must be sold. A Sales Release form is required for ALL Grand and Reserve Grand Champions in each species. In the event that an exhibitor owns a Grand or Reserve Grand Champion, they may sell one other animal of any market species. In addition, an exhibitor who has more than one Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champion that must sell, that individual will be required to sell all qualifying animals but will not be allowed an extra. This rule takes precedence over the one youth, one animal rule. In the instance that an exhibitor qualifies to sell an additional animal, as the result of exhibiting a Grand or Reserve Grand Champion animal, then the exhibitor's additional animal will sell at the end of the auction in the 4th round. Round 4 for be for any lots resulting from extra animals.

Ex: Exhibitor has the Grand beef; they can sell another beef to sell in round 4. The exhibitor has Reserve Hog and Grand Goat, then that is all they can sell.

This new revision will be re-evaluated after the fair in 2024.



We would like to set up the youth for success by handing out this sheet that helps outline the stalling and setup of county fair. This items can also be found in the premium book. Please feel free to reach out if you have any questions!





All exhibitors must have a panel on each side of their cattle, and bed cattle on shavings or mulch



Feed stored needs to be stored in containers (not in feed sacks), and exhibitors need to haul all manure down to manure pile located by the old beef wash racks at the end of the day.



Exhibitors will be given 4 feet per animal and 8 feet for tack per family.



All stalls need to be set up by Friday July 14 (this means tack/equipment unloaded, stalls bedded, and panels setup)



During fair cattle need to be fed, and stalls/tack stall/aisle need to be cleaned by 9:00 AM. Exhibitors need to respect the stock tanks. They are for the cattle to drink, not for playing in.
