Updates on Policies for Success

The changes to the Policies for Success are listed below:

- Membership and cloverbud fees are \$55 for the 4-H Year
- Treasurer and Secretary books are required
- Livestock animals must be housed within county lines. Unless they reside outside the county, but have county membership then the animals can reside at their residence. Anything beyond that needs to have prior approval from the Extension Office.
- Families/youth will belong to one 4-H club (no splitting membership between multiple clubs for youth member or family members). For special circumstances please reach out to the extension office.

Livestock Beef Tag In– Save the Date

Date: February 17, 2024

Location: Owens Livestock Arena at El Paso County Fair Grounds

Back-Up Date: This date will only be used if communicated by the extension office and species superintendent due to weather. Please make sure to have both dates clear on your calendar. There are no alternate dates for tag in due to the number of volunteers it takes to run this event. February 24, 2024.

Required Sign Up (Time Slots): Time slots will be assigned this year so please fill out the **google survey link** <u>https://</u> <u>docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLSf2suEaoiNV0swc0TNxGj pewalq 7iwZbR23J8r5C hT3RlQ/viewform?usp=sf link</u> to be assigned to a time slot. This form MUST be filled out and submitted by January 26, 2024 to participate in beef tag in.

Expectations:

- Please be on time or early! If you show up late or past your time slot you will have to be moved to the back of the line. We believe in giving priority to those scheduled in their time slot so we will not allow families who are late or miss their time slot to cut in front of others.
- If our team is running behind, please be patient as we are working with live animals and technology.
- You must bring your animal with a halter already on before it will be unloaded, or it will not be tagged, retinal scanned, or weighed.
- Any uncontrollable animals will NOT be tagged, retinal scanned, or weighed! This is at the discretion of the extension agent and species superintendent. The idea is to work with them ahead of time!
- Please have your calves brand inspected prior to coming to tag-in. Do not forget to bring your brand inspection papers.
- Tag-in is the only time State Fair Nominations will be taken and it will cost \$3 per animal nominated.
- Retinal scans at tag-in are \$3.00 per animal due at tag in.
- The first 6 ear tags free, \$1.00 per tag over six.
- Only CASH accepted.
- Fees are due before the animal can cross the scale and be tagged in.

ALL ANIMALS MUST BE CASTRATED PRIOR TO BEING WEIGHED AND TAGGED AS A 4-H MARKET PROJECT. CASTRATION MUST BE DONE PRIOR TO ARRIVING AT THE FAIRGROUNDS (NOT THE DAY OF TAG-IN) AND HEALED AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE. ALL MUST BE DEHORNED.

State Fair Nomination Cards and Premise ID's: Remember all 4-H and FFA exhibitors must have their premise ID# on their nomination cards to be accepted for State Fair. This is a State Fair Policy NOT a requirement to participate in the local 4-H program. This information should be completed on nomination card at the time of tag-in. You will need to apply for your premise ID number well in advance of tag-in, so they have time to assign you one. Please do so 3-4 weeks before you need it. Youth County Council

Recap and Upcoming Meetings

The November County Council meeting, led by Jonathan Vrabec, started with the Pledge of Allegiance and the 4-H pledge with an attendance of 12 members, 7 parents, 1 leader advisor, and 1 extension agent. Advisory committees discussed plans for the upcoming year, with the Livestock Advisory Committee focusing on awards and a Swine Superintendent search. The Shooting Sports Advisory Committee reported on recent activities and the need for volunteers. The Tabletop Advisory Committee reviewed Star Program requirements. The CSU Extension reported successful officer training and ongoing efforts to hire a new agent/county specialist. They should have an announcement soon. Club news highlighted positive feedback on the Band app and an upcoming dance by the Trailblazer club. In unfinished business, we discussed our December Fun Night meeting open to the county, and future meeting locations were debated.
