What is a 4-H Community Service?



4-H Community Service (or "Service Learning") is a critical part of the 4-H Learning Experience. Community Service projects provide an opportunity for 4-H members to participate in meaningful activities that help connect them to their community.

WHAT MAKES A GOOD COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT?

A Good Community Service Project "TAPS!"

Timely

Community Service projects should be relevant to the time in which they
occur. Focusing a community service around a specific time of year (like an
autumn leaf rake up, or a Valentine's Day visit to a senior center) is a great
way to brainstorm fun ideas! Be creative!

Active

 Community service projects should always involve some "doing." Members should be taking an active role in their project.

Purposeful

 Community service projects should always start with a goal or purpose, and the service should always work towards completing that goal.

Selfless

Ultimately, community service should end in a positive result that <u>does not</u>
 <u>provide a tangible reward or direct benefit</u> to the service learners—
 although members should absolutely feel pride and personal satisfaction at
 a job well done!

WHAT IS AN EXAMPLE OF A GOOD (AND **NOT SO GOOD) COMMUNITY SERVICE** PROJECT?

GOOD COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS

- Assist with 4-H programs that benefit the community.
- Raise money through donations/drives/programs/etc., for charity organizations.
 - Note: funds raised <u>MUST</u> be directly given to the organization, and <u>CANNOT</u> be deposited first into a 4-H Club or Council account. Club funds CAN like buying notecards for letter writing, but CANNOT be directly donated.)
- · Letter writing campaigns.
- (Military personnel, seniors, etc.)
 City/Community cleanups.
 - (family homes, parks, waterways, cemeteries,
- Host a supply drive.
 - (holiday toys, food, coats, school supplies, hygiene items)
- Host a garage sale to benefit a community service organization.
- · Installing public space goods. (wheelchair ramps, playgrounds, benches, etc.)
- Assist at an animal shelter.
- Organize & Host a Blood Drive.
- Visit folks in need.
- Plant flowers or trees/clean trails.
- Participate in a charity run/walk.

NOT COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECTS

- Any fundraising activities meant to benefit a 4-H club or council.
- Attending a community event and promoting 4-H.
- Walking in a parade.
- · Assisting a club with regular club
- Raising money on behalf of for-profit
- Cleaning up/providing repairs to State or County Fairgrounds.
- Participating on behalf of political organizations.
- Cleaning up the barn/yard of a family member/friend.

4-H Promotional Activities vs. Community Service

Remember: 4-H Community Service should provide a positive, needed and ultimately selfless benefit to the community. Completing a community service project promotes the 4-H Program in a positive light.

4-H Promotional Activities, while a great way to show 4-H Leadership and promote 4-H, do not qualify as community service projects.



Accommodations Form — NEW in 2024

Hello 4-H Families!

As a reminder to all, El Paso County 4-H and Colorado 4-H firmly believe that all 4-H members should be able to participate in 4-H Events and Activities with their peers successfully. This includes providing reasonable accommodation requests made on behalf of 4-H members. In an effort to streamline accommodations requests, El Paso County 4-H has developed a fillable form that can be accessed via the 4-H Website. This form should be used to request accommodations for each 4-H Event that accommodations may be required.

Colorado 4-H recognizes that accommodations may be requested orally and in person, up to the date of the event. However, the timing and manner of a request potentially reduces county extension's ability to determine reasonable accommodation. Because it can take time to plan for some accommodations, El Paso County 4-H requests that the form be submitted no later than 14 days prior to the event or activity. Submitting a request for accommodation on shorter notice may reduce or limit county extension's ability to implement the accommodations. Please note that the accommodation may not be the one proposed by the participant.



I have tried to highlight as many changes as possible, however is it ultimately the responsibility of the 4-H families to know and understand the expectations of competing at County Fair. Please see a *rough outline of the changes* made this year below, and the link to each premium book.

- Must compete in three or more divisions for Overall High Point
- Outlined premier exhibitor if entered in multiple showmanship classes

Miniature Horse Premium Book: 2024-Miniature-Horse-Premium.pdf (colostate.edu)

Added driving classes

Livestock Premium Book: 2024-Livestock-Rulebook Final.pdf (colostate.edu)

- Clarified wording in the general section
- Added hard copy required for health certifications
- Animals must be housed in county
- Goat show—fitting products must be removed following the show
- Beef show—removed Select Sale classes.
- Swine show—each exhibitor can weigh and stall 4 hogs; 3 divisions instead of 5 divisions
- Outlined Premier Exhibitor for goat
- Livestock Master Showman—must show animals they won with in showmanship
- Removed Beef Pen of Three since there was no entries the previous year

Animal ID's in 4HOnline due by April 30th, 2024. Animals that need to be in 4HOnline are horse, miniature horse, pygmy goat, dairy goat, breeding livestock, cat, dog, and camelids (Ilama/alpaca). If Animal ID's for the above projects are not in by April 30th, the animals are not eligible to show at the county fair.

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Seeking Additional Club Leaders

Have you ever thought about leading a 4-H Club? It takes a team of dedicated volunteers, and we are seeking more adults to become club leaders. We would like to expand the number of clubs offered throughout our county and provide more opportunities for youth in our county to join 4-H and find a club they can call home! Meat Quality Assurance

Meat Quality Assurance Training teaches the youth about the quality of meat and food products that come from livestock. Quality assurance for livestock producers means making a promise to the consumers, or the people who consume meat, eggs, milk, and dairy products, from food production animals. The promise made is that products from livestock will be the highest possible quality and producers will do everything possible to make these products safe to eat.

- The project areas required to complete MQA training is goats, sheep, cattle, swine, poultry, and rabbit.
- MQA Training will be offered twice a year. For 2023-2024, a classroom style format will be used.
- All first year 4-H members and current 4-H members advancing to intermediate (11 years old) or senior (14 years old) 4-H members must complete a Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) workshop if enrolled in goat, beef, sheep, swine, poultry, or rabbit project (s).
- All 4-H members are required to attend a MQA training during their first year in a livestock/ rabbit/poultry projects regardless of their age.
- This must be done at least 45 days prior to the El Paso County Fair in order to be eligible to exhibit at the county and/or state fair (s).
- Proof of compliance must be submitted to the El Paso County Extension Office.
- If the 4-H member is unable to attend an MQA workshop in El Paso County, the 4-H member may attend an MQA workshop in another county (information for completion must be sent to the El Paso County Extension Office by the deadline from the county that the MQA training was completed in).

The last date MQA will be offered is **Tuesday April 16th, 2024** at 6:00PM at the Extension Office.



4-H Sheep Clinics

Nutrition Program to be held April 23rd at 6:30pm at the Akers Building (3274 Akers Dr., 80922)

Ever wonder what the best options and products to use to get your mkt lamb projects looking their best for the big show? How about learning why you feed sheep different

than you do some other species? At this educational workshop we are going to get into lamb nutrition. You will learn about the

sheep's digestive tract and what makes different from yours. What nutrients your lambs need and when. You will come away with a better understanding of how different feed stuffs work inside of the animal. We will also demonstrate how a ration is developed. We will get into the sometime head spinning world of supplements, how they are used, what works and what might just be a waste of money. Please sign up by noon on April 23rd using the link below.

Sheep Training and Daily Prep Workshop to be held May 29th at 6:30pm at the El Paso County Fairgrounds (366 10th St, 80808)

This hands-on program will help you learn how to train your animal to walk on a halter, and then by hand. We will also practice how to start teaching them to set their feet. We will cover daily care and conditioning so your animal will look and feel their best on show day. In fact, have you ever wondered what the judge is feeling your animal for in the show

they say one animal feels fresh, 12 O'clock, washed the loin, over conditioned, too fat, green, stale etc. will have some hands-on

examples and let you handle and feel what different animals are like and discuss what different terms judges use to describe show lambs. For this workshop you will want to bring 1-2 of your project animals as well as a halter, any combs/brushes you use on your lambs and a bucket. Animals do not have to be clipped/sheared but if they are, that is good. Please register by May 28th 4 p.m. using the link below.

Market Swine Tag Pickup

1. Any youth member that plans on showing MARKET swine at the county fair needs to fill out the Google Survey by April 4, 2024, found at this <u>LINK</u>

- 2. Please make sure that the youth member is enrolled in the 4-H Program under the Market Swine Project in 4HOnline. Members/Families will not be given tags until the member is actively enrolled in the 4HOnline system. There are NO EXCEPTIONS to this rule.
- **3**. The Swine project members are responsible for tagging their own animals, pulling DNA samples, and if applicable, filling out county fair nomination forms.
- **4**. Mark you calendars for Swine Tag Pick Up on April 25th, 2024, at Swink Hall (El Paso County Fairgrounds) from 5:00 6:30 PM to pick up tags. Please remember these important items the night you attend.
 - a. DNA envelopes cost \$3 per animal (CASH)
 - b. State fair nominations cost \$3 per animal (CASH)
 - c. The money will be collected on April 25, 20254, in CASH only
 - d. First year families are required to attend the tagging clinic at 4:30 PM that night in order to receive their tags

For tagging your own hogs, you will need to purchase a tagger if you do not already own one. It must be a specific brand to work with the Y-Tex tags that you will receive. There are two links attached as a reference to what you need to purchase.

- UltraTagger Compact by Y-Tex (This is the recommended one that features a quick release pin)

It is also recommended that you have blood stop, corn starch, pr baking flour on hand in case you hit a vein when tagging. If you hit a vein and the bleeding does not stop within 15-20 minutes, contact your local vet. We will have detailed instructions in the packet available for families to use.


Once the 4-H families have picked up their packets, tagged their hogs, and filled out the required paperwork please mark your calendars for Friday May 10th, 2024 from 5:00—6:30 PM to drop off your packets in Owens Arena (El Paso County Fairgrounds). Pleas use the original packet given to you to store all your required elements. The checklist of what should be in the packet is:

- DNA Envelopes sealed with provided sticker
- County Fair Nomination Forms (and State Fair Nomination Form if applicable) make sure all the information is fill ed out along with signatures
- Clearly printed photographs of hogs (what is required for the photos will be stated in your packet when you pick it up)
- Any extra tags you did not use







Recap and Upcoming Meetings

The February youth county council Meeting was held at El Paso County Veterans Services. Twenty-one people were in attendance with 6 clubs represented.

There were no dog advisory, horse advisory, or livestock advisory reports. There will be a shooting sports leader training from the 8th through the 10th of March in Pueblo.

The small animal committee chose judges and ordered ribbons. The Tabletop committee approved star specifications and went over county contest; and fashion review. 




