All branding (i.e. clothing, awards, logos) for committees, clubs, or project groups should be sent to the Extension Office for approval. It is important that the 4-H and Colorado State University policy is followed so that both organizations are represented properly.

Common mistakes in branding are not putting the dash in "4-H", using the correct 4-H logo, etc.

This is the correct 4-H logo.



## How to Use the 4-H Name and Emblem

#### FACTS

- It is a Federal mark protections and standards exceed that of trademarks and copyrights
- Using the 4-H Name and Emblem is a privilege and authorization of use can be revoked for misuse
- There are National Standards for the use of the 4-H name and emblem
- CES and USDA give each Land Grant University the authority and that is passed to the State 4-H Office and then to the Local Extension Offices.




### TEXT USE

NOT Acceptable: 4H, 4h, 4 H, 4 h

Using 4-H is to be written as numeral "4" separated from a capital "H" with a hyphen (not a dash, slash or space)





### Emblem Use

- The Official emblem is a green fourleaf clover with a white "H" in each leaf with the stem bending to the right
- The 4-H Emblem may not be altered in any way
- The 4-H Emblem is not open to reinterpretation or reconfiguration regardless of the intended use.
- The official color is 100% PMS 347 green
- The 4-H Emblem should never be screened, shaded, gradated or appear in a multi-colored hue.
- May NOT be used as a watermark.
- Use of emblem on t-shirts and flyers/posters must be approved by the Extension office and 4-H Agent.

	The "H's" on the green clover can be white, black or metallic gold.
	The "H's" on the black clover should be white.
* *	The "H's" on the white clover can be black or green.
