

NEW Animal Record Book Policies

- 4-H members must complete an E-Record book for atleast one animal project area the 4-H member is enrolled in and receive a score of 70% or above.
- If the 4-H member is enrolled in multiple animal projects, they can select the project area they wish to complete a record book in. For the other animal projects, they must either exhibit them at County Fair or the current year OR write a complete 4-H story using the record book standards and receive a 70% or above to receive project completion OR can choose to complete a record book to standards.
- If the 4-H member is enrolled in MARKET LIVESTOCK this record book is mandatory for project completion and must receive a 70% or above.
 - Example: If the youth is enrolled in Market Sheep and Market Goat, they can pick one species (animal project area) such as Market Sheep to complete the record book on. For Market Goat they would either exhibit them at the County Fair of the current year OR write a 4-H story up to standards set in the record book and receive a 70% or higher on the 4-H Story to reach project completion OR they can chose to do a record book.
 - Example: If the youth is enrolled in Breeding Beef and Market Swine they would have to complete the Market Swine book. The same applies if entered in other animal projects.
- Dairy and Pygmy Goats are required to be put in the breeding livestock book. There are two breeding supplement pages. One is titled Goat Doe Record supplement page which is used for breeding boar does and pygmy does. The second one is titled Breeding Goats supplement page which is used for Dairy Goats.
- Poultry Record Book
 - Will no longer use breeding supplements for any poultry projects
 - They will use the livestock record book, this includes show birds
- 4-H members are required to use 4-H E-Record folders to qualify to go onto higher grading, which can be purchases at the El Paso County Extension Office or on the Shop 4-H Website.
