### \*\*NEW\*\* 4-H NEW Member Enrollment Deadline – March 1, 2025

This deadline is for any <u>NEW</u> 4-H members enrolling in 4-H—this includes 4-H families new to the program, or new members from existing families enrolling for the first time.

### \*\*NEW\*\* 4-H Project Add/Drop Deadline - April 1, 2025 at 5:00 PM

This deadline is for TABLETOP & 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS PROJECTS ONLY.

Members must add or drop any Tabletop (general projects) and 4-H Shooting Sports Projects by this deadline. <u>After April 1, 2025 at 5:00 PM</u>, any general/4-H shooting sports projects the member is enrolled in is what they will be eligible to participate in at County Fair, and must be completed for the 4-H year.

Any 4-H ANIMAL PROJECTS have an Add/Drop Deadline of May 1, 2025. ### **Accommodations Form**

Hello 4-H Families!

As a reminder to all, El Paso County 4-H and Colorado 4-H firmly believe that all 4-H members should be able to participate in 4-H Events and Activities with their peers successfully. This includes providing reasonable accommodation requests made on behalf of 4-H members. In an effort to streamline accommodation requests, El Paso County 4-H has developed a fillable form that can be accessed via the 4-H Website. This form should be used to request accommodations for each 4-H Event that accommodations may be required.

Colorado 4-H recognizes that accommodations may be requested orally and in person, up to the date of the event. However, the timing and manner of a request potentially reduces county extension's ability to determine reasonable accommodation. Because it can take time to plan for some accommodations, El Paso County 4-H requests that the form be submitted no later than 14 days prior to the event or activity. Submitting a request for accommodation on a shorter notice may reduce or limit county extension's ability to implement the accommodations. Please note that the accommodation may not be the one proposed by the participant.

# Congratulations to the El Paso County Parliamentary Procedure Team—RESERVE NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

The Parliamentary Procedure Team, which was mainly comprised of the Youth County Council Officer Team from 2024 being Grace Candela, Kaleb Gramsch, Connor Holiday and Laura Richards who earned the opportunity to represent Colorado at the National Competition in Denver on January 9<sup>th</sup> by being State Champions.

The team started prepping for the national contest in November and worked diligently over the Christmas break to prepare. The team comes prepared with some unfinished business and a few other standard items to get their mock meeting started but then are given 3 problems or items of new business and at least 6 different types of motions they must apply to address the items of new business. They have 20 minutes to prepare and strategize prior to presenting their meeting to the judges. They must complete this mock meeting in 20 minutes or less.

Following their presentation, they are each asked a series of knowledge questions about Parliamentary Procedure and Roberts Rules of Order. They received nearly perfect scores on their ability to conduct opening ceremonies and order of business which includes minutes, reports and handling unfinished business. They scored an impressive 88% on the new business portion which was worth 1590 points across 3 judges. Further, they accomplished it all within the 20-minute time limit (they even took a calculated risk and incorporated a recess into the meeting. Most teams would have voted that down but not these risk takers, they went after the points!).

I am really proud of this group and the hard work and dedication they put in. I think if you ask them, they will tell you Parliamentary Procedure and Roberts Rules Of Order can be FUN! There were plenty of laughs along the way. If you see them, thank them for representing El Paso County and Colorado so well and give them a BIG high five for a job well done!

# Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) Training— Last Session April 3, 2025

Meat Quality Assurance Training teaches the youth about the quality of meat and food products that come from livestock. Quality assurance for livestock producers means making a promise to the consumers, or the people who consume the meat, eggs, milk and dairy products, from food production animals. The promise made is that products from livestock will be the highest possible quality and producers will do everything possible to make these products safe to eat. •

MQA Training will be offered twice. For 2024-2025, an interactive classroom style format will be used. The April MQA will be the last session offered.

The project areas required to complete MQA training is goats, sheep, cattle, swine, poultry, and rabbit.

All first year 4-H members must complete Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) in the projects listed above.

Current 4-H members advancing to intermediate (11 years old) or senior (14 years old) must complete a Meat Quality Assurance (MQA) in the projects listed above.

This must be done at least 45 days prior to the El Paso County Fair to be eligible to exhibit at the county and/or state fair(s).

Proof of compliance must be submitted to the El Paso County Extension Office.

If the 4-H member is unable to attend an MQA workshop in El Paso County, the 4-H member may attend an MQA workshop in another county (information for completion must be sent to El Paso County office by the deadline from the county that the MQA training was completed in)

The last MQA session will be offered **April 3, 2025, at 6:00 PM** at the Extension Office (17 N Spruce Street). Please park on the south side parking lot and enter through the Staff Only door on the south side of the building. Please register for MQA with this link:

Animals that need to be in 4HOnline are horse, miniature horse, pygmy goat, dairy goat, breeding livestock (swine, goat, sheep, and cattle), cat, dog, and camelids (llama/alpaca). If Animal ID's for the above projects are not in by April 30th, the animals are not eligible to show at the county fair.

SMALL ANIMAL PROJECT

I encourage and highly suggest that 4-H families review the new Premium Books for the 2025 County Fair Competitions. This is the rulebook and backbone to the expectations of competing at County Fair. I have tried to *highlight* as many changes as possible, however is it ultimately the responsibility of the 4-H families to know and understand the expectations of competing at County Fair. Please see a rough outline of the changes made this year below, and the link to each premium book. \*\*\*Please note this is NOT a comprehensive list\*\*\*

### Dog

- The main change coming from Colorado State 4-H, is that they don't give NQ's (Non-Qualifying) to the 4-H kids.
- Deleted some NQ language from the premium book.
- Colorado State 4-H changed one exercise for the Pre-Graduate Novice Class.

#### Horse

- No longer one horse and rider combination required for Overall
- Exhibitors can show up a division (not down)
- Once an exhibitor was won Overall in Walk Trot, Novice, and Limited they are no longer eligible for that award again
- Added wording about "Levels" on how they work in conjunction with showing
- New To You and the county version of novice has been removed
- Hunter Hack and Cattle classes has been removed

### Livestock

- Once stall assignments have been posted there will be no switching with other families or moving from assigned stalling.
- For livestock/horse/miniature horse/camelid shows the exhibitors must always have closed-toed shoes and long pants in the show arena and when handling animals for safety and risk management.
- Fair treatment concerns must be filed in writing on the Fair Treatment Challenge Form with the CSU Extension 4-H staff person on duty at the fairgrounds accompanied with a fee of \$100 in cash (no checks) within 24 hours of the incident. Please see the Fair Treatment Protocol attached to the Fair Treatment Challenge Form for further information and procedures.
- "Point of contact" emergency contact information for each exhibitor and species must be on file in the Livestock Office for Superintendents. Contact list for superintendents is posted on the CSU Extension website.
- Drenching will be allowed with drench guns. The use of stomach pumping devices is prohibited.

#### **Beef**

- To bring a porter cooler to the county fair grounds you must register in FairEntry and pay a \$25 fee.
- All cattle shown at County Fair MUST have RFID tags.
- During the beef shows, the staging area is limited to two adults per exhibitor.
- If there is less than 40 entries in the market show, we will eliminate divisions and move to the Top 5 Overall out of the class winners (the judge can continue to pull multiple entries from one class in placing order to the Top 5 Overall if they so choose).
- All market beef will be weighed in per official fair schedule. Market beef must weigh a minimum of 1100 pounds to be eligible to show.

#### Goat

Goat-khana/Sheep-khana brought back

### **Swine**

• Market swine will be allowed to stall and show up to TWO (2) animals.

### **Miniature Horse**

- Added \$10 stalling fee
- Added Performance Halter and Versatility classes
- Jump heights lowered to 24" maximum
- Ground driving cones changed to 4 feet instead of 3 feet
- Ground Driving and Driving cones changed to 10 cone maximum
- Reinsmanship patterns and section have been completely redone
- Show will be on one day (Sunday)

### **Small Animal**

- Pocket pets- Class 7: Rescued (The rescue class is to include pocket pets that have been rescued that display irreversible malformations or deformities but are in current good health due to care.)
- Exhibitors will be expected to explain to the judge the background of their rescued pet and the rehabilitation process.

#### Rabbit

- Exhibitors are required to complete a maximum of 2 hours in the rabbit barn.
- All rabbit members that were not able to attend fair clean up are required to help with rabbit fair tear down.
- It is highly recommended that project members bring bottled/jugged water from home.
- Market rabbit members need to keep their carrying cages under the tables for pictures and sale.
- All market rabbit exhibitors must be enrolled in the breeding project in addition to the market project. Project members are required to produce their own market rabbits.
- Meat Pen Class- The age limit is not over 70 days.
- Rabbit showman will only be allowed the following minutes based on age group: Senior and Intermediates 8 minutes, Juniors 10 minutes. Sign-ups will be first come, first serve basis. If an exhibitor needs a specific time, please communicate the time on cage in day. We work with other specie superintendents to ensure when multiple shows are occurring simultaneously, we will work around showmanship times so exhibitors don't miss their turn for showmanship in any species.
- Supreme Market Rabbit- Attending a clinic/show (MQA, SAAC organized clinic or rabbit show outside of county fair)
- Showmen are to wear a plain white long-sleeve (no pockets preferred) shirt and dark pants. Participants should be free of hats, jewelry, nail polish or anything that is distracting and takes away from their showmanship. Hair should be pulled back and away from the participants face.

### **Poultry**

- All leg bands must have preprinted numbers on them.
- Feed and bedding may be stored neatly under the cages or behind counters in the barn. Any supplies stored behind the counters cannot block access to the shelves.
- The exhibitor is responsible for letting their buyer know that no birds may be removed from the barn until Sunday between 9:00- 10:00 AM. Exhibitors must be in the barn to meet their buyer allowing them to remove bird(s).
- Showmanship buckles will NOT be released until the champion showman who earned the buckle turns in an unsealed thank you letter.
- Class 12- Game Bird (any non-standard poultry species such as quail, pigeon, peafowl, etc.) A champion and reserve will be chosen from all species. This class will not be eligible for bird of show or reserve bird awards.
- Supreme Market Fowl- Attending a clinic/show (MQA, SAAC organized clinic, or poultry show outside of County Fair)
- Poultry Agility contest will be held in the poultry barn. Check fair schedule for date/time. Exhibitors must be signed up 30 minutes prior to start time.
- Poultry Skillathon- Poultry Knowledge placing as new category

  Score cards must be turned in 1 hour after start time of the contest to be counted.
- September 5 deadline for Poultry Achievement Award

### **Camelid**

- High Point award is the exhibitor with the overall highest score. This score is derived by adding the placement points from classes 1-8 together. Classes will use a 6-1 point scale with 0-6 points max. Champions and reserve champions will receive ribbons in each age division.
- Exhibitors must wear long-sleeved western or white collared shirts tucked in or appropriately tailored, along with dark-colored jeans or slacks, or a dark ankle-length skirt. Jackets, vests, and/or western hats are also permitted but not required. Shoes should be boots or sturdy shoes for the show ring and completely cover the foot. Inappropriate footwear will disqualify the exhibitor, who will be dismissed from the ring immediately. Vest and western hats are allowed.
- Sportsmanship Award
- Camelid Mentor Award

### Cat

- Must be registered in 4HOnline in the Activity for Cat Showing
- REMOVED- All 4-H cat exhibitors are required to present a tri-fold board and a completed record book. These will be judged with tabletop and are eligible for State Fair.

### Cavy

- Cavy must be treated for mites one month before the County Fair. Please provide paper documentation with date, time, the name and signature of person who administered treatment if not done by one of the superintendents at the time of County Fair cage in.
- Only ten cavies per breed, per exhibitor may be shown.
- All cavy are required to have an ear tag to be shown, unless under the age of 3 months. In the case of multiple similar looking cavy a sticker ear tag may be used for the cavy under 3 months of age. All other cavy the age of 4 months and older MUST have an ear tag. If ear tag has been ripped out and ear is ripped significantly, a sticker ear tag may be used instead of retagging.

### Item #2 Page 3:

The Sale Release deadline for any extra qualifying animals resulting from an Exhibitor having Grand and/or Reserve Grand Champion animals is due by the stated deadline for the Exhibitor's last Market Show.

### <u>Item #15 Page 4:</u>

The hide of the Sale Animal needs to be free of water, oil, and/or conditioners when entering the sale arena.

### Item #19 Page 4:

Any Exhibitor needing additional help in the sale ring must complete and submit the Accompaniment Request Form no later than the Exhibitor's Sale Release deadline to obtain approval from the Sale Manager for the request. In such circumstances, any parties providing assistance must be currently enrolled 4-H/FFA members.

### <u>Item #20 Page 4:</u>

Any market animal missing a tag or having a tag that appears to have been tampered with or altered must be retinal scanned and/or DNA tested at the initial Fair weigh-in and appropriately retagged prior to the Sale.

### Item #21 Page 4:

Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals will be retinal scanned or have DNA specimens pulled prior to the Sale.

### Item #29 Page 5

The thank you notes are due on Saturday, July 26<sup>th</sup>. Prior arrangements must be made with the Sale Manager if thank you notes cannot be returned

- 3. Applicant must demonstrate leadership, teamwork, and commitment to community service.
- 4. Applicant must be over eight years of age at the time of application.
- 5. Applicant must be an exhibitor in the current year's County fair.

If chosen to receive this award, you will receive a certificate, check, be featured in the Fair Guide, and an invitation to the VIP Reception at the Fair where you will be recognized. The award itself has been doubled and is now \$1,000. Along with receiving the award, the recipient will be expected to give a presentation at one of the Fair Advisory Meetings, highlighting your plans to use the funds received whether it be your education, 4-H/FFA project, etc.

Applications will be online at ElPasoCountyFair.com and must be submitted by April 30 to be considered for the 2025 El Paso County 4-H/FFA Award.

## 2025 Colorado State Fair Information

A couple things to remember for 2025:

- Beginning in 2025, the Colorado State Fair will only accept DNA for identification, retinal scans are no longer accepted. DNA envelopes will be available for exhibitors to purchase around March 1st. Details will be posted on the website. Remember, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to order and submit DNA, not the Extension/FFA offices.
- 2. They will continue to do family nominations, just make sure each exhibitor fills out a form listing all family nominated animals. They will not accept forms made out to the "Smith Family".
- 3. The procedures will be posted on the website, just not the nomination forms as the office will not accept nomination forms from exhibitors.
- 4. The tentative livestock schedule and market deadlines will be posted on the website around the first of January.

## First Year Market Lamb Program

To help grow and incentivize starting a Market Lamb Project, we have started the First Year Market Lamb Program. This program will provide the 4-H member with a market lamb to show at this year's County Fair. The member will exhibit the lamb in both the regular market class as well as a special class for first year market lamb program participants.

#### Guidelines include the following:

- 4-H Members enrolled in their first year of the lamb project will learn more about their project through monthly project meetings. Participants will need to attend 3 of 5 educational meetings or they may substitute one of the meetings by exhibiting at a prospect or jackpot show.
- Any member is welcome to attend one of the clinics (Open to anyone interested in learning about the sheep project).

#### Clinics will be held on:

- -Feb 24th at 6:30pm Akers
- -March 24<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. Akers
- -April 23rd at 6:00 p.m. Akers
- -May 21st at 6:30 p.m. at the Fairgrounds
- -June 4<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. at the Fairgrounds

Subjects and speakers will be announced in 4-H Friday Emails.

- Members will receive one market lamb through this program to be paid for from their sale proceeds (from any animal they choose to sell through the junior livestock sale at the county fair not to exceed \$500).
- They will exhibit in the special First Year Program Class during the County Fair, as well as the regular market class and showmanship. Youth should plan on purchasing a second market lamb on their own. Members do not need to purchase the second, but lambs do not do well alone, so a buddy should be purchased. Siblings may not need to do this if both qualify for the First Year Program.
- The First Year Program is only available to 4-H Members in their first year of the project, but the educational sessions are open to all 4-H Members, regardless of experience. Watch for more details in the next newsletter as well as the dates of the educational programs which will start in February!

The application for the First Year Market Lamb Program will be coming out later this month in one of the 4-H Friday Emails but start attending clinics now.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP DETAIL**

- 1. As many as two (2) scholarships of up to \$1,000 each will be budgeted for 2025.
- 2. The El Paso County Junior Livestock Sale Committee (Sale Committee) will determine the number of scholarships and amounts awarded.
- 3. Applicants may be interviewed by a panel of members designated by the Sale Committee.
- 4. All decisions by the Sale Committee will be final.
- 5. Scholarships will be awarded to the recipient after providing proof of satisfactory performance of being a full-time student for one semester or term and proof of registration for the following semester or term from the school/college/university.
  - A. Transcript and proof of enrollment should be sent to the Manager of the Sale Committee for payment of the scholarship funds to either the recipient or educational institution as directed.
- 6. In the event that the scholarship recipient leaves school, the recipient will be allowed a **one (1)** year period to re-register at an institution of higher learning in order to continue the scholarship.
- 7. Scholarship recipients will be chosen and notified no later than June 10, 2025.
- 8. Announcement of scholarship award winners will be made during the Junior Livestock Sale at the El Paso County Fair.
- 9. Any violations of the 4-H or FFA Code of Conduct and/or Code of Ethics by a scholarship recipient will be grounds for the Sale Committee to rescind an awarded scholarship.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

High School graduating senior or college freshman enrolled in any Market Projects, Large & Small Animal Projects with the expectation for completion in August 2025.

A Sue Crozier Livestock Committee Scholarship may be received only once.

#### **OUALIFICATIONS**

Enrolled in the El Paso County 4-H or FFA Livestock Program the year applying.

Satisfactory completion of a livestock project the year applying.

Minimum of three years in 4-H or FFA club work (can be elsewhere).

Minimum of three years successful completion of market livestock projects.

Students applying for the Scholarship must be enrolled in a livestock project, but do not necessarily have to be enrolled in a market livestock project, as long as they have successfully previously completed three years in a market livestock project.

Participation in 4-H and FFA livestock activities, county fair, livestock judging, etc., to the degree your education or work schedule allows.

Minimum of a 3.2 out of 4.0 high school grade point average – and college GPA if applicable.

      - i. If home-schooled, the applicant should endeavor to get a recommendation from an educational mentor other than, or in addition to, his/her parent instructor.
    - C. LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION SHOULD CONTAIN:
      - 1. Applicant's potential for doing satisfactory work in higher education.
      - 2. Applicant's interest in 4-H/FFA purposes and interest in activities involving live-stock.
      - 3. Letters should be in <u>sealed envelopes</u> and may be included in packets from the applicant or mailed directly to the Committee by the author.
  - 4. A photo of you and your livestock project.
  - 5. The following <u>must</u> bear a courier postmark indicating it was accepted at a postal outlet by <u>or on April 15, 2025.</u> A metered postmark is not acceptable.
    - A. Completed and signed application;
    - B. Required transcripts;
    - C. Two letters of recommendation; and
    - D. Photo of you and your livestock project.
  - 6. The application will be reviewed by the Sale Committee to ensure all qualification and requirements are satisfied. The applicant may then be contacted to schedule an interview
